KAKINADA – In his letter to the district collector, Dr P Sivarama rishna, director of 'Sakti', a voluntry organisation based at Ramsachodavaram, has requested the structions to the uthorities for prosecuting Mr V ankara Reddy for allegedly conavening the Andhra Pradesh Private Forest Act by felling 2,000 ees in the Chintalapudi forest of Y

Dr Sivarama Krishna said illegal selling of a tree attracted Rs. 5,000 ne or two years imprisonment.
